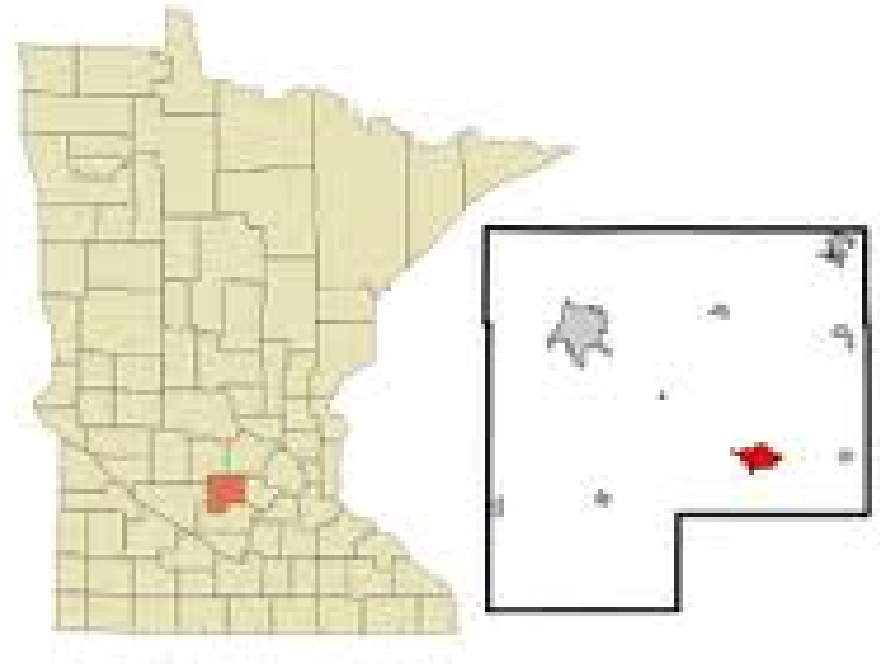
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# Glencoe, Minnesota

- 110-bed LTC facility attached



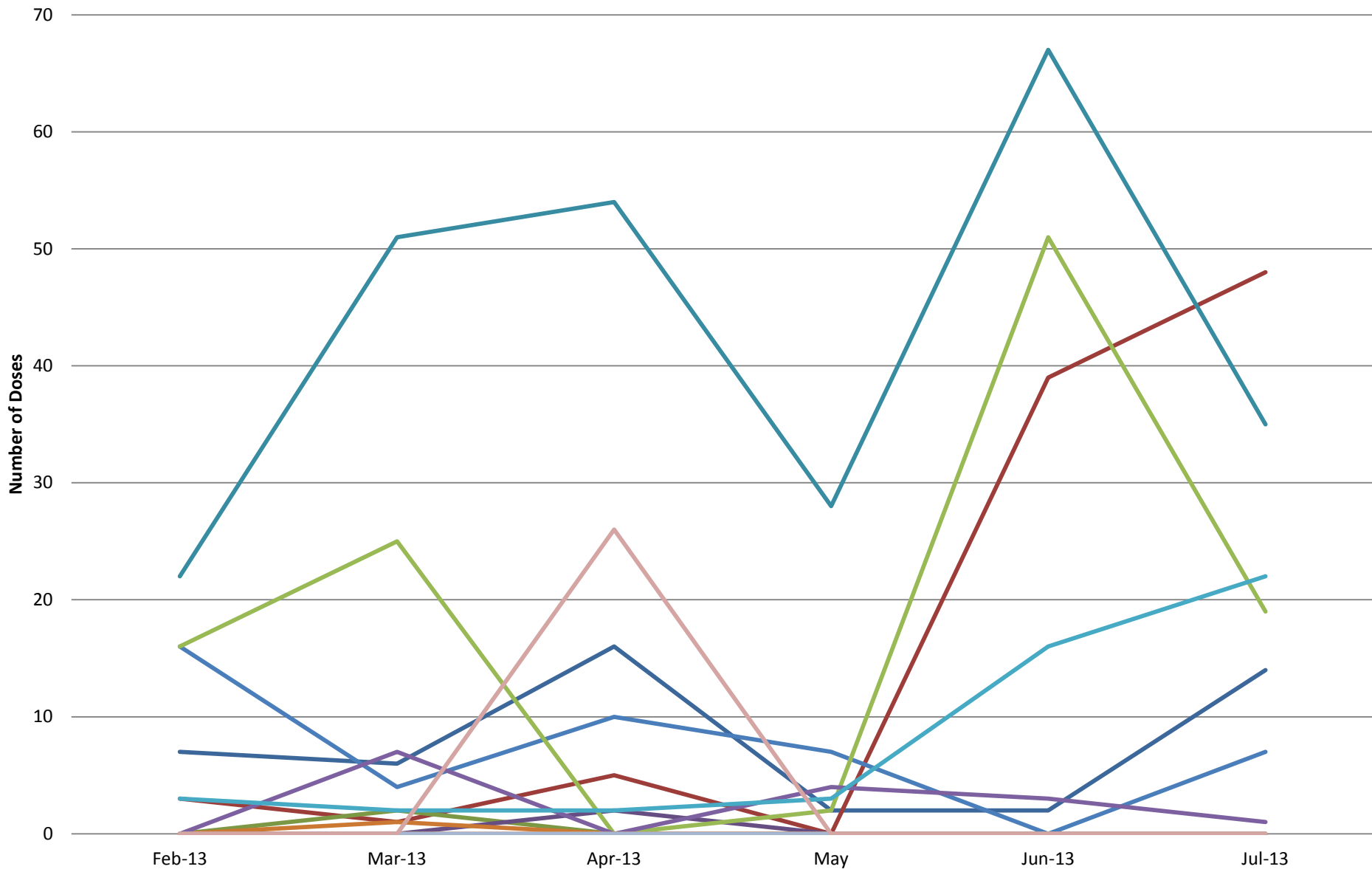
# Current State of ASP at GRHS

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# PO Antibiotic Doses February 2013 - July 2013: Inpatient/ER/Surgery




